Common Thread Pillowcases—over 775 delivered

The Common Thread Ministry, born out of a heavy heart for the dying, especially the AIDS patients who die alone, has been in existence since the summer of 2009. In that time, over 600 pillowcases have been delivered to Lower Cape Fear Hospice, the AIDS Clinic in Wilmington and various individuals in terminal situations.

As we travel around the district for workdays, we've made so many new friends and have been moved by the spirit in which the work is done. Love and care goes into each pillowcase, with a prayer of blessing when we finish for the day. Ironed inside each pillowcase is the scripture, *Psalm 4:8 "I will lie down and sleep in peace, for you, O Lord, make me dwell in safety."* Once, a professing atheist AIDS patient was admitted to ICU at the hospital. The clinic chaplain brought him a pillowcase for comfort but explained that it had scripture inside and he may prefer to have another one. He gladly accepted the scripted pillowcase and said "Right now, I need all the Jesus I can get." Many AIDS patients have lost touch with or been deserted by friends and family. Gifts to them are treasured.

If your church is interested in hosting a work session, it's very simple. You only need to gather your friends — we bring all the necessary materials, sewing machines, sewing notions and training. The pillowcases completed that day can be distributed to your local Hospice care center or they can go to the Lower Cape Fear Hospice center in Wilmington or to the AIDS Clinic. You may also know of terminally ill people in your church community who are in homes or nursing care.

Common Thread Ministry is raising funds to continue the work. Initially, we were funded generously by a Mission Seed Grant given by the North Carolina Conference. Those funds are almost depleted. Donations are gladly accepted—checks can be made out to Oleander UMC Common Thread Ministry. However, if you wish to wear your Common Thread support, white sweatshirts and ladies t-shirts are also available, embroidered with a beautiful, colorful butterfly for a cost of \$22.00 each., half of which goes toward fundraising. Your support has been exceptional and will continue through your generous gifts.

FOLLOWING JESUS –THROUGH and AFTER THE STORM

The week before Easter Sunday, known in the church as “Holy Week”, was quite a challenge this year. We had the usual worship services planned; Palm-Passion Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services; Easter Sunrise Service and Easter Service in our sanctuaries. For many, these are the activities that make Easter, Easter. But this year brought some challenging distractions for some of our churches.

Sam Loy, our acting Disaster Response Coordinator for the Wilmington District of our conference was asked to assess the damage caused in the bounds of the district by the tornadoes on April 16th. There were three areas of significant damage; in Elizabethtown near First Baptist Church; in Bladenboro; and near Ammon on NC 242 north of Elizabethtown. As usual, the Baptist Men were well mobilized and seemed to be taking care of the needs in Elizabethtown and Bladenboro. There was a need for our help in the Ammon area.

Four miles up the Old Fayetteville Road from Ammon, up next to the Cumberland County line, five homes had been destroyed. Two single-wide mobile homes on the southwest side of the road had been blasted across the road. An elderly man and his son died in one of the homes. Across the road a woman died when her double-wide home was flattened. Close behind this home was another single-wide mobile home. The couple living in this home had the ride of their lives as it was picked up and swung around about fifty feet and slammed up against a large pine tree. This tree probably saved their lives by preventing the home from rolling over. After the storm the only thing left of the tree was its trunk sticking up about fifteen feet from the ground. Every window in the home was blown out and the hot water heater was sucked out of the side of the home. But the couple escaped without any physical injuries.

After striking these four homes the tornado hit the woods and took a forty-five degree turn and then struck another home occupied by an elderly couple about a quarter mile away. It pushed this home off its foundation and dropped it, causing some floor joists, ceiling joists and rafters to break like twigs. This house was later condemned by the building inspector.

The woman in the double-wide attended Windsor UMC in Ammon. The folk at Windsor responded to the destruction of her house by helping her family and the other families sift through the rubble for anything of value. Then came the tasks of helping meet the immediate needs of the two surviving couples for food and housing and then to move all the rubble to the road so that the county would be able to load it up and haul it away.

The Disaster Response Center for our conference at MERCI in Goldsboro was contacted and they offered help from an Emergency Response Team (ERT) from Annandale UM Church in the DC area of Virginia. They brought a 12 person team down for Friday and Saturday of Holy Week to help these families affected by the disaster.

A call was then put out by email to the churches in our district for anyone who could help in this recovery activity. It was difficult for very many people to help because of other Easter weekend commitments, but those who responded were very much appreciated. There were over 40 people from Annandale and Windsor churches and 11 other churches in the district helping on Friday and Saturday.

This is a long narrative but the hope is that it will help you understand some of the miracles that happen as the result of disaster response activities done in the name of Jesus...

What a sight it was to see so many people take on the huge task of disposing of the debris of four mobile homes. But many hands made the road-side piles of debris grow steadily. This was a miracle in itself. But the true and lasting miracles happen in the hearts of the people involved. The willingness of strangers to come and help, lifted the spirits of the victims of the storm, even those who lost loved ones. They knew that they were not alone in their grief and in the tremendous task of putting their lives back together. Because of your generosity and that of others in the Wilmington District we were able to help the two couples with some money to help with immediate needs like housing and food and fuel for their cars. Many people from across the community helped with these needs as well.

Then, there was the lesson learned by those involved regarding our connectedness in the United Methodist church to other congregations in and outside of NC. The work of Windsor UMC was such a great witness of caring by a local congregation without regard to whether someone was a member or even whether someone deserved help. They were there because they loved Jesus and they knew that Jesus loved the ones that they were helping. The people from Annandale UMC were a living example of the importance of having people in our church trained as ERTs. The response of those from the other eleven churches witnessed to the willingness of people to help strangers when they know there is a need. The Risen Lord's presence was palpable at times.

All in all, the lesson of this Holy Week activity is that, just as God was able to bring resurrection through Good Friday, He continues to bring new life out of death and destruction in even larger measure when we commit ourselves to be His disciples, especially in the tragedy of this world.

Work continues to go on in many different areas of central and eastern NC and the United Methodist Church will continue to partner with other faith communities to help meet human need, both material and spiritual, in this tragedy. 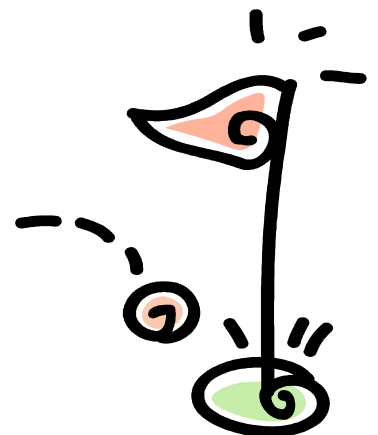
